Despite the governmental refusal to make PSHE statutory, the statistics surrounding poor PSHE and SRE are stark.

RECENT RESEARCH BY THE SEX EDUCATION FORUM SUGGESTS THAT:

of young people did not learn how to get help if they were abused 53%

did not learn how to recognise grooming
